

Yard Waste Ban April 1st - November 30th

Beginning April 1st, yard waste cannot be placed in your curbside trash receptacle. To dispose of grass clippings and leaves, you may either contact your hauler and request a yard waste specific receptacle or take it to the Waste Transfer Station located at 1200 Hamilton Street. Residential tree debris may also be taken to the City's Recycling Center located just north of the Platte River Bridge on S. Broad Street (HWY 77). The Recycling Center is open the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of each month from 8 a.m. to noon.


